Also in attendance were Interim City Manager Andrew Avantagiato, City Clerk Megan Lawrenz, Neighborhood Services Director James Masters, Leo Schlesener and Christine McDonald.

6a. Water Line at Lake – The city water line was tapped into and there are only a certain number of times the line can be tapped into, it could have been within the city managers preview to approve, but Mayor Bell thought that it should have come through the commission for approval. Staff to create an internal policy that all water line taps for the Hope line need to be approved by the commission.

Alley Maintenance between 10th and 11th Street, South of Walnut Street – Mayor Bell would like to double check with the city attorney to make sure that it is legal for the city to remove the asphalt and replace it with gravel like most of the other allies in Herington. Vehicle for the Water Department – There were two vehicles available last week, however now there is only a GMC 2500 for \$56,785.00.Funds will be split between Sewer and Water Production, both budgeted 25k for vehicles, the remainder would be out of major equipment from water production. Commissioner Gares made a motion to approve the purchase of a GMC 2500 not to exceed \$57,000, seconded by Commissioner Castleberry. Motion carried 5-0.

Tanker Purchase for the Fire Department – Staff is moving forward with the AFG Grant after the procurement policy written and approved. The price has increased \$369,348.
