TYPICAL DUTIES:

Responds to alarms of fires and medical emergencies, hazardous materials, vehicle accidents and other emergencies with a pumper, ladder, rescue, brush truck, or support vehicle; performs light and heavy rescue activities including low angle rescue, water rescue, auto extrication, CPR and rescue equipment operation.

- Lays and connects hoses; holds nozzles and directs fog or water streams; raises and climbs ladders; uses chemical extinguishers, bars, hooks, lines, and other equipment; ventilates burning buildings by opening windows and skylights or by cutting holes in roofs and by using positive pressure ventilation; extricates victims and removes persons from danger; performs salvage operations such as throwing salvage covers, sweeping water and removing debris.
- Participates in fire drills and attends regular classes in firefighting, rescue, fire prevention, hazardous materials, first responder, apparatus maintenance and care, vehicle extrication, and related subjects; progresses in firefighting certification levels.
- Flushes fire hydrants and tests fire hydrant flow.
- Serves as a weather spotter.
- Performs overtime as required.
- Maintains personal safety and makes critical decisions in a confused, chaotic, and potentially life-threatening environment.
- Performs routine housekeeping and maintenance duties at the fire station or in connection with fire equipment.
- Participates in pre-fire planning of buildings and performs inspections of businesses to ensure compliance with fire and building codes.
- Conducts tours, participates in public education functions, and presents to individuals or groups on safety topics and duties of firefighting.
- Communicates using phones, mobile, and portable radios, and computers, and related software applications.
- Completes incident, training and maintaence reports and submits them on time.
- Other duties as required.

MINIMUM EDUCATION, TRAINING, AND EXPERIENCE REQUIREMENTS:

This is an entry-level position, some verifiable firefighting experience within the last three years is required at a minimum, Firefighter I is preferred. Completion of high school level education or G.E.D. Must posses or have the ability to obtain a Kansas Class C drivers licenes within 90 days. Must be at least 18 years of age at the time of appointment. Must maintain an insurable driving record. Firefighter I, NIMS and S190/S130 is required within one year of employment. Firefighter II within 2 years of employment, EMT within 3 years of employment. Additional training as required.

RESIDENCY REQUIREMENTS:

This position must reside within the USD 487 School District.

PHYSICAL DEMANDS OF ESSENTIAL JOB FUNCTIONS:

Work Type: Very heavy, exerting up to 100 pounds of force occasionally, and/or up to 50 pounds of force frequently, and/or up to 20 pounds of force constantly to move objects.

Climbing/Balancing: Climb inclines and ladders, uneven surfaces, balance required

Walking: Moderate amount required Stooping/Bending: Frequently

Stand/Sit: Sit about 50 percent of the time
